

FC Goa aim to reclaim 2nd spot

FATORDA: FC Goa will look to bounce back into second place on the Indian Super League table when they host East Bengal, who will be looking to get back to winning ways, at Nehru Stadium, here, on Sunday.

The Gaurs, currently third with 27 points from 15 matches, are coming off three draws in their last five outings.

ISL PREVIEW

East Bengal, sitting 11th with 14 points from an equal number of games, on the other hand are searching for consistency after two consecutive defeats.

FC Goa's five-match winning streak against East Bengal FC gives them a psychological edge.

However, they recently dropped to third after

A victory will not only see Goa reclaim second place but also keep their hopes alive for a top-of-the-table finish. East Bengal, on the other hand, have struggled up front this season, creating the fewest goal-scoring chances in the league (126).

Their tally of 16 goals is among the lowest, with only bottom-placed Hyderabad FC (11) and debutants Mohammedan Sporting (8) scoring fewer.

For FC Goa, Armando Sadiku has been a stand-out performer, scoring nine goals this season. One more strike would make him the

11th player in club history to reach double digits in ISL goals. Brison Fernandes has also shone, with five goals, eight successful dribbles, and 16 goal-scoring chances as the duo will hold key to their return to winning ways.

East Bengal will rely on Hijazi Maher's defensive solidity, with the player averaging 1.36 interceptions per game.

Forward Naorem Mahesh Singh, who leads the team in goal contributions (three goals and two assists), will aim to break his scoring drought against FC Goa this season.

In nine ISL meetings, FC

Goa have dominated with six wins and two draws. East Bengal FC have managed just one victory, highlighting the Gaurs' upper hand in this rivalry.

FC Goa Head Coach Manolo Marquez accepted that the season has entered a challenging phase right now. “Every game is very tough. We are in a moment where collecting points is very difficult. But, this is football. We need to be focused on ourselves,” he said. “The team is slowly getting better”

East Bengal FC Head Coach Oscar Bruzon said his team is gradually improving themselves and laying the groundwork for their success ahead.

Despite putting in a valiant effort at home, Abhijith Kurungodan's late strike in the 86th minute secured the win for Kerala, leaving Dempo SC eager to make amends on the road.

Meanwhile, Rajasthan United FC head into this match after a dramatic 1-1 draw against 10-man Delhi FC. James Singh's red card gave Rajasthan the upper hand, with Alan Oyarzun converting a penalty in the 70th minute to put them ahead. However, Delhi's resilience saw Okwa equalise late in the 83rd minute, forcing Rajasthan to settle for a point.

As it stands, Dempo SC sits in seventh place on the I-League table with 10 points from eight matches, while Rajasthan United is just one spot above in sixth with 11 points.

PANJIM: The penultimate round of late Shri Manohar Parrikar 3rd Goa International Open Grandmaster Chess Tournament 2025 saw intense battles as IM Ayush Sharma (Madhya Pradesh), GM Sethuraman SP (Tamil Nadu) and IM Slizhevsky Alexander (Russia) emerged as joint leaders with 7.5 points each after nine rounds at the Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Indoor Stadium, Taleigao Plateau, on Saturday.

The competition remains fierce, with Goa's IM Ethan Vaz, IM Aranyak Ghosh (RSPB) and IM Tologon Tegin Semetei (Kyrgyzstan) closely trailing at 7 points each, setting the stage for a thrilling final round. IM Ethan Vaz continued his stellar run, securing a sensational victory against IM Rohith Krishna S (Tamil Nadu) to stay in contention for the top spot with 7 points.

IM Ameya Audi faced a challenging match, conceding a point to IM Slizhevsky Alexander, leaving him at 6 points. IM Ritviz Parab bounced back with a win against Moxit J Shah (Gujarat) and now stands at 5.5 points. GM Anurag Mhamal, after a tough game against IM Gochelashvili David (Russia) where he faced a loss, is at 5 points.

Rohit hints players have reservations about 10-point diktat, to discuss issue with BCCI

MUMBAI: It's not a "punishment", said chief selector Ajit Agarkar but India captain Rohit Sharma on Saturday expressed his and his teammates' reservations towards the recent BCCI policy that placed restrictions on the time that players would get with their families while on tour. The BCCI has not officially announced the guidelines but media has already reported on the 10-point diktat. One of the major contentions in policy document is going back to the old days where families are allowed only for 14 days on long tours. Any deviation would need coach Gambhir's approval.

Denis Law, Man Utd & Scotland great dies at 84

MANCHESTER: Denis Law, the Manchester United and Scotland great, has died. He was 84. The death of Law, the only Scottish player to win the Ballon d'Or, was announced by his family through United on Friday. In 2021 he was diagnosed with dementia. "It is with a heavy heart that we tell you our father Denis Law has sadly passed away. He fought a tough battle but finally he is now at peace," the statement read. Law is forever linked with Bobby Charlton and George Best, the three-pronged strike force that led United to English league titles in 1965 and '67 and the European Cup in 1968 — a first for an English club.
