Their tally of 16 goals is among the lowest, with only bottom-placed Hyderabad FC (11) and debutants Mohammedan Sporting (8) scoring fewer.

For FC Goa, Armando Sadiku has been a standout performer, scoring nine goals this season. One more strike would make him the

11th player in club history to reach double digits in ISL goals. Brison Fernandes has also shone, with five goals, eight successful dribbles. and 16 goal-scoring chances as the duo will hold key to their return to winning

East Bengal will rely on Hijazi Maher's defensive solidity, with the player averaging 1.36 interceptions per game.

Forward Naorem Mahesh Singh, who leads the team in goal contributions (three goals and two assists), will aim to break his scoring drought against FC Goa this season.

PTI. HYDERABAD: The great Sunil Chhetri scored his 10th goal of the season to help Bengaluru FC share the spoils with Hyderabad FC following a 1-1 stalemate in their Indian Super League match, here, on Saturday.

Devendra Murgaonkar's (21') first-half strike was neutralised by Chhetri (78') in the second essay of the match. Chhetri, 40, touched the 10-goal mark for the second time in his ISL career, after having netted 14 times in the 2017-18 campaign.

Bengaluru FC held 62.4 per cent of the possession, but had a solitary shot on target, which Chhetri converted to get them a point out of this match.

The opening phase of the game was slightly cagey as both teams struggled to create clear chances. Bengaluru FC attempted to break past the Hyderabad FC defensive line but were not exactly co-

hesive in their moves. Chhetri was flagged offside twice in the opening 20 minutes. The home side retaliated soon afterwards, as they embarked on a positive phase of play with Allan Paulista winning a free-

Rohit hints players have reservations about 10-point diktat, to discuss issue with BCCI

MUMBAI: It's not a "punishment", said chief selector Ajit Agarkar but India captain Rohit Sharma on Saturday expressed his and his teammates' reservations towards the recent BCCI policy that placed restrictions on the time that players would get with their families while on tour. The BCCI has not officially announced the guidelines but media has already reported on the 10-point diktat. One of the major contentions in policy document is going back to the old days where families are allowed only for 14 days on long tours. Any deviation would need coach Gambhir's approval.

Denis Law, Man Utd & Scotland great dies at 84 MANCHESTER: Denis Law, the Manchester United and Scotland great, has died. He was 84. The death of Law, the only Scottish player to win the Ballon d'Or, was announced by his family through United on Friday. In 2021 he was diagnosed with dementia. "It is with a heavy heart that we tell you our father Denis Law has sadly passed away. He fought a tough battle but finally he is now at peace," the statement read. Law is forever linked with Bobby Charlton and George Best, the threepronged strike force that led United to English league titles in 1965 and '67 and the European Cup in 1968 - afirst for an English club.
