Pernem man booked for sending obscene messages to Ponda woman

PONDA\MARGAO: Bharat Petkar, 62, resident of Pernem has been booked by Ponda police for allegedly harassing a woman by sending her obscene messages and issuing threats to her husband. The complaint, lodged by a Pondabased woman, stated that between 2021 and January 2025, the accused persistently sent her unsolicited, sexually explicit messages and made vulgar comments using images from her WhatsApp stories.

Additionally, Petkar is accused of issuing threats to the

complainant's husband.

Meanwhile Maina-Curtorim Police have registered an offence against Rupesh Parsekar, a driver from Calata, for allegedly harassing a Nuvem woman through WhatsApp messages and calls. The woman, who lodged the complaint, claimed that since May 2025, Parsekar-who works as her driver—repeatedly sent unsolicited messages and made persistent voice and video calls in an attempt to initiate a personal relationship. Despite clear disinterest, the accused allegedly continued his advances. Police have booked Parsekar under various sections and PSI Praful Giri is leading the investigation.

67-year-old pedestrian dies after bus collision at Margao

MARGAO: Joseph Baptista (67), a resident of Margao, died after being knocked down by a bus near the Old Market Circle on May 30. The complaint, filed by constable Sadanand Gurav, stated that Irfan Shaikh (47), also from Margao, was driving the Ashok Leyland bus rashly when it hit Baptista, who was crossing the road. The victim was rushed to South Goa District Hospital (SGDH), where he succumbed to injuries during treatment. Police have preserved the body for medico-legal formalities and are continuing the investigation.

Curtorim, resident booked for illegal sand and stone storage

MARGAO: Govind Lamani (32), of Sada Vasco, has been booked for illegally storing 580 cubic metres of sand and 530 cubic metres of laterite stones at Curtorim. The case was registered following a complaint by Ratnakant Govenker, Deputy Director of the Department of Mines & Geology. A deadline of 28 November has been set for this relocation, with the department warning that failure to comply may result in disconnection of power supply until the issue is rectified.

In a public notice, the department explained that electricity meters installed inside locked or inaccessible homes pose challenges to accurate billing and

KERI (SATTARI): As the legal battle in the Supreme Court of India between Goa and Karnataka continues over the diversion of the Mhadei river to the Malaprabha basin via the Kalasa and Banduri nullahs (canals), a sobering fact has vet to resonate amid the heated discussions three Goans were killed by elephants displaced by dam-related work across the Kali river.

"One man was killed in Revora, near Mapusa, by an elephant that had wandered from Dandeli into Goa," recalls renowned environmentalist Rajendra Kerkar. "Two more victims were from Pernem taluka, including one from Ibrampur," added Kerkar, who is also the author of Glimpses of Goa.

According to Kerkar, any decision involving the diversion or sharing of water must also consider the fragile environment, ecology, and wildlife that the river systems support along their course.

Among them, Banduri is a perennial nullah that contributes a large quantum of water — a key point Goa is attempting to establish with evidence before the

The tribunal originally set up to resolve the dispute gave its decision in 2018. However, Kerkar points out that Goa, Maharashtra, and Karnataka have all since filed petitions before the Supreme Court.

"So far, no hearing has taken place. Therefore, no determination has been made regarding the availability of sufficient data to assess the basin's yield or the amount of water that can be awarded," claims Kerkar.
