Akal Takht holds Sukhbir Badal guilty, tells him to clean toilets and serve in langar

CHANDIGARH/AMRITSAR: In a scathing indictment of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) and its president Sukhbir Singh Badal, Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Raghubir Singh on Monday imposed religious punishment on Badal and other senior Akali leaders, saying they were unfit to lead the Sikh community. In an unprecedented move, the Jathedar also revoked the title of Fakhr-e-Qaum (Pride of the Nation) awarded to former Punjab Chief Minister Parkash Singh Badal. As part of the punishment, Sukhbir Badal and core committee members of the Akali Dal, including cabinet ministers from 2015, were ordered to clean toilets, serve in the langar (community kitchen), perform Nitnem (daily Sikh prayers), and recite Sukhmani Sahib. Placards were also placed around their necks as part of the sentence.

Telangana: Woman constable murdered by brother in suspected honour killing

HYDERABAD: A 29 year-old woman constable was murdered allegedly by her brother in Ibrahimpatnam near here on Monday in a suspected case of honour killing, police said. The woman's husband in a complaint to police accused her brother of killing her as he was against their inter-caste marriage, they said. Police said the accused was allegedly hatching a plan to eliminate his sister for a week "as he did not like the couple's inter-caste marriage". As part of the plan the accused also deputed a person to watch her movements and came in a car, hit her two-wheeler and stabbed her on the neck, police said adding the accused has been apprehended.

Neighbour arrested over theft of Rs 1 cr, 267 sovereign gold heist in Kerala

KANNUR (KERALA): The Kerala police on Monday arrested the neighbour of a trader in connection with the theft of over Rs 1 crore and 267 sovereigns of gold, valued at approximately Rs 1.52 crore, from the latter's residence in Kannur district about two weeks ago. The accused, Lijeesh (45), was taken into custody on Saturday by an investigation team formed to probe the case, the police said. His arrest was recorded on Monday after he confessed to his crime on Sunday evening during interrogation. Kannur city police commissioner, Ajit Kumar said in a press conference that Lijeesh, a Gulf returnee, a welder by profession, carried out the theft by breaking the window of the house in Valapattanam.

Heavy rainfall continues in Tamil Nadu, Puducherry

Villupuram worst affected, Southern Railway suspends operations

PTI, VILLUPURAM: Villupuram district in north Tamil Nadu continued to reel under unprecedented flooding on Monday following extremely heavy rainfall, virtually blocking access to villages and residential colonies as bridges and roads overflowed, inundating huge acreage of standing crops and affected rail and road traffic, leaving passengers stranded.

CYCLONE FENGAL

A total of 48 trains via Villupuram were affected, and Southern Railway in the evening announced restoration of services with speed restrictions and underlined that all efforts were underway to restore all the services in the route.

In Tiruvannamalai, tragedy unfolded as five bodies were recovered from a house crushed by a boulder that rolled down a hilltop following a mud slip on the night of December 1 during rains. A search was

on for two more people.

Vehicles were submerged up to two feet and the roads came completely under water in several parts of Villupuram, and nearby Cuddalore, where residents were stunned by the flooding.

River Thenpennai was in spate, trees were uprooted in several areas and electricity poles were tilted. Several houses, particularly tiled tenements, at Aragandanallur in Villupuram were almost submerged with water level

rising over 4 feet.

Parts of Krishnagiri and Dharmapuri districts, in west Tamil Nadu, too witnessed floods unseen in the past two decades. Uthangarai in Krishnagiri district received a whopping 50 cm rainfall, Villupuram district received upto 42 cm, and Harur in Dharmapuri received 33 cm. Cuddalore and Tiruvannamalai recorded 16 cm, and all of which was from 8.30 am on December 1 to 8.30 am, on the following day. In Villupuram district alone, 3,617 persons have been housed in 65 relief shelters and 15 disaster relief teams are operational.

Many vehicles, including cars and vans were dragged by floods from a road at Uthangarai into low-lying area, shocking people.

Several of the vehicles were owned by local tour operators. Road access from Uthangarai to towns such as Krishnagiri and Tiruvannamalai has been affected due to

ROAD RAGE CASE

15 CISF personnel booked; force files counter FIR

PTI, MUMBAI: Police have registered a case against 10 to 15 CISF personnel for allegedly assaulting a doctor, his brother and another person in a road rage incident in Maharashtra's Navi Mumbai township, officials said on Monday.

The central force said it also filed a police FIR against the driver of the car and his brother as the former "hurled verbal abuses and attempted to assault" the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) bus driver.

It has ordered a court of inquiry (CoI) into the incident, which it claimed took place after the car "suddenly" overtook the CISF bus and "abruptly stopped" in front.

The accused CISF personnel have been issued notices in connection with the incident, which took place at 10:15 pm on November 29, the officials said.

Parl deadlock ends after consensus on Constitution debate

PTI, NEW DELHI: The government and opposition parties reached an agreement on Monday to break the week-long impasse in Parliament with the dates announced for a discussion on the Constitution, to mark its 75th year of adoption, in the LS and the RS.

The Lower House will take up the discussion on the Constitution on Dec 13 and 14, and the Upper House on December 16 and 17, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said following a meeting Speaker Om Birla held with floor leaders of different parties.

Opposition parties had demanded discussions in both Houses of Parliament to mark the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution by the Constituent Assembly.

Rijiju told reporters that all parties have agreed to allow Parliament to function from Tuesday, and both Houses will take up

their listed agenda items. He expressed confidence that LS and RS will function smoothly from Tuesday.

Following back-channel talks, the breakthrough was achieved at the meeting chaired by Birla and attended by Gaurav Gogoi of the Congress, DMK's T R Baalu and TMC's Kalyan Banerjee among others besides Rijiju and his deputy in the ministry Arjun Ram Meghwal.

Several opposition leaders, who attended the meeting, also echoed Rijiju's views about Parliament functioning smoothly from Tuesday.

Asked about other issues being raised by the opposition such as the Sambhal violence and the unrest in Manipur, Rijiju said Birla has made it clear that any matter can be raised in line with the rules, while requesting parties to allow Parliament to function smoothly.

Cong workers stopped from going to Sambhal

Scores of Congress workers jostled with police personnel and tried to scale barricades outside the party office in Lucknow on Monday as a party delegation led by its Uttar Pradesh unit chief Ajay Rai was prevented from leaving for Sambhal, which has been made out of bounds by administration after the November 24 violence.

Amid high drama, Rai, who took the driver's seat in his car with senior party leader PL Punia next to him, could not leave for the "fact-finding" visit even as scuffles broke out between the cops and the slogan-shouting party workers, who tried to clear the way for their leaders.

Farmers' 'Delhi Chalo' march on land compensation stopped in Noida

PTI, NEW DELHI/ NOIDA: Farmers from different parts of Uttar Pradesh demanding adequate compensation for their lands acquired by the government marched towards Delhi on Monday but were stopped at the Noida-Delhi border where they sat on a dharna. The farmers said if their demands were not met within seven days, they would again march towards Delhi.

Raising slogans of "Bol Kisan, Halla Bol", the protesting farmers gathered at the Mahamaya flyover on the Dadri-Noida link road and began their 'Delhi Chalo' march around 11:30 am.

Massive traffic snarls caused inconvenience to commuters crossing the Delhi-Noida borders as police set up multiple layers of barricades and deployed heavy security to stop the march, which coincided with Parlia-

ment's Winter Session.

Bumper-to-bumper traffic was witnessed at Noida's Chilla border for several hours as the protesters, waving banners and flags of various farmer groups, crossed the initial barricades.

They were finally stopped near Dalit Prerna Sthal, around a kilometre from the Chilla border, an entry point to Delhi, where

senior police officers tried to pacify them.

Traffic on the stretch resumed around 6 pm after the protesting farmers gave a week's time to fulfil their various demands, including the payment of land acquisition dues, as mandated by the Land Acquisition Act, 2013.

In a statement, the Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) — an umbrella or-

ganisation of 12 farmers' bodies — said the farmers had decided to stay at Dalit Prerana Sthal for the time being following assurances from the authorities that the chief secretary would meet to "discuss and settle their demands".

It said the agitation would continue till their demands were met.

"The Yogi Adityanath government has failed to ensure justice to the farmers. The BJP-led Uttar Pradesh government has not revised the land circle rate since 2017 and land-owners have been denied adequate, lawful compensation and other benefits assured by the Land Acquisition Act, 2013," it said.

Shashikant, a member of the SKM's national executive, told PTI that the protest was organised under the aegis of the SKM's Gautam Buddh Nagar unit.

Karnataka IPS officer dies in road accident

PTI, HASSAN (KARNATAKA): A 26-year-old IPS officer on his way to take up his first posting died in a road accident in Hassan district, police said on Monday.

Harsh Bardhan was a 2023-batch IPS officer of the Karnataka cadre and hailed from Madhya Pradesh, they said.

The accident took place on Sunday evening, when the tyre of the police vehicle he was travelling in allegedly burst near Kittane in Hassan taluk, following which the driver lost control and the vehicle hit a house and a tree on the roadside, police said. Soon after getting the news of the accident, Akhilesh Singh, who is posted as Sub Divisional Magistrate in Madhya Pradesh, rushed to Karnataka to collect the remains of his son.
