Stokes adamant Archer 'desperate' for England return

LONDON: England captain Ben Stokes says Jofra Archer is "absolutely desperate" to be involved in the upcoming home series against India and so revive a Test career that has been stalled for more than four years. Archer enjoyed a spectacular start with England in 2019. The Barbados-born fast bowler played a key role in the team's 50-over World Cup final win at Lord's and made his presence felt in a dramatic drawn Ashes series with Australia. England have kept faith with Archer. He is due to make his first-class return for Sussex against Durham on Sunday as part of a plan that could see him feature during a five-match series with India.

India's Senthilkumar signs off with bronze medal at Asian Squash C'ships

KUCHING (Malaysia): India's Velayudhan Senthilkumar signed off with a bronze medal after losing to second seed Alex Lau Tsz Kwan of Hong Kong in the men's singles semifinal at the Asian Squash Championships, here, on Friday. The Indian, ranked 45th in the men's singles chart, went down 1-3 (9-11, 11-13, 11-5, 6-11) to the world number 41 Lau in a marathon 65-minute last four clash. Both the losing semi-finalists are awarded bronze at the continental showpiece.

Bangladesh's lead over Sri Lanka nears 200 in first Test

GALLE (Sri Lanka): Bangladesh edged ahead of Sri Lanka on day four of the first Test in Galle on Friday, extending their lead to 187 runs with seven wickets in hand. The visitors finished at 177-3 after a strong partnership of 68 between opener Shadman Islam and skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto. All-rounder Milan Rathnayake dismissed Shadman for 76 but veteran campaigner Mushfiqur Rahim, fresh off a first-innings century, joined his captain to steady the innings. Bangladesh 2nd innings: 177-3 (Shadman Islam 76, Najmul Hossain Shanto 56).

Australia drop struggling Labuschagne for first West Indies Test

SYDNEY: Australia on Friday dropped Marnus Labuschagne for the opening match of their three-Test tour of the West Indies after a poor run of form while Steve Smith is out injured. Teenager Sam Konstas and Josh Inglis come into the starting XI for the opening match in Barbados starting on Wednesday. "Marnus at his best can be a really important member of this team," chair of selectors George Bailey said.

South Korea lifts 26-year ban on foreign goalkeepers in K League

SEOUL (South Korea): A 26-year ban on foreign goalkeepers in South Korea's top soccer league has been lifted for the start of the 2026 season. Only Korean goalkeepers have been allowed to play in the K League. The rule was introduced in a bid to protect homegrown talent when there were only 10 professional clubs. The K League announced after a board meeting in Seoul this week that because there's now 26 professional clubs in the top two tiers of competition, there's enough room for international goalkeepers.

Ishan signs short-team deal with Nottinghamshire

NOTTINGHAM (England): Indian wicketkeeper-batter Ishan Kishan has signed a short-team deal, subject to international clearance, with Nottinghamshire to play two County matches, the club said on Friday. The 26-year-old Kishan will be a replacement for South Africa's Kyle Verreyne in the Nottinghamshire side and will be available for selection for their matches against Yorkshire and Somerset. Verreyne, a member of South Africa's World Test Championship final-winning side, will be away on national duty for a two-Test series against Zimbabwe.

Real star Mbappe released from hospital

MIAMI: Real Madrid superstar Kylian Mbappe has been released from hospital in the United States after suffering a stomach bug, the Spanish giants said on Thursday. Mbappe, who is in the USA at the Club World Cup, had what the club called "an acute case of gastroenteritis" and was taken in for tests and treatment. "Our player Kylian Mbappe was discharged from hospital this afternoon and has returned to the Real Madrid training camp," Los Blancos said.
